## **USGS Volcano Notification Service (VNS)**

VNS is a free service that sends automatic notices (emails or texts) about volcanic activity at U.S. monitored volcanoes, including Hawaiian volcanoes. You can sign up to receive these notifications at <a href="http://volcanoes.usgs.gov/vns/">http://volcanoes.usgs.gov/vns/</a>.

Through VNS, the Hawaiian Volcano Observatory issues:

- Daily/weekly updates for Kīlauea and Mauna Loa,
- **Monthly updates** for Hualālai, Mauna Kea, Lōʻihi, and Haleakalā.
- Status Reports about volcanic activity during ongoing events,
- Volcano Activity Notices if/when significant events or changes in volcanic activity or alert levels occur, and
- **Information Stateme**nts to provide additional information or explanations of non-volcanic events on an "as needed" basis.

You can choose the types of notifications that you wish to receive—all of them or just some of them. You can also select the volcanoes you want to hear about—choose Hawai'i only or include other U.S. volcanoes as well.

The <u>Civil Defense Emergency Notification System</u> is a free service that allows you to receive timely notifications about emergency situations on the Island of Hawai'i. Civil Defense encourages residents and visitors to sign up so that you can be notified in case of an emergency. Standard charges for incoming calls and text messages apply.
