


# Student Volcanology Day at Mount St. Helens

For High School Students Interested in Exploring a Career in Geology

Saturday, May 11, 2013 – 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Mount St. Helens Science and Learning Center at Coldwater



This is an opportunity for high school students to meet USGS volcanologists, learn about new tools and technologies, and explore geology careers. Join us as we celebrate May as Volcano Awareness Month and commemorate the upcoming 33<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of the May 18, 1980 eruption of Mount St. Helens.

- **10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. – Student Volcanology Workshop** in the Science and Learning Center
- **12:30 a.m. to 1:15 p.m. – Brown Bag Lunch** (bring your own, with coffee & soft drinks provided)
- **1:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. –** Join geologists for a **2.3 mile Guided Hike** exploring evidence of the 1980 eruption on the Hummocks Trail (wear sturdy hiking shoes and dress for changing spring weather).
- **4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. –** Students are invited to **visit the Johnston Ridge Observatory** and view the award winning movies and exhibits (students and one accompanying family member free admission).

**There is no charge for the Volcanology Workshop and Hike, but pre-registration is required.** A total of 50 students will be registered with a maximum of two students (and two alternates) accepted from each High School. Students will need to provide their own transportation to Mount St. Helens and bring a lunch.

Registrations will be assigned in the order received and **selected registrants will be notified by email.** Registrants will be asked to reconfirm their attendance and alternates will be contacted regarding any available openings by the end of April.

**LOCATION:** The Mount St. Helens Science and Learning Center is located on State Route 504, 43 miles east of Interstate 5 (Exit 49) and the town of Castle Rock. Continue east on 504 (45 minutes to 1 hour) until you see the turn-off for Johnston Ridge. Continue straight ahead past the exit for Johnston Ridge (don't turn off and head downhill) and continue into the Science and Learning Center parking lot.
